GREEN TEAM

I have always loved cooking and baking. As I've gotten older, I have taken an interest in food in a different way. I am interested in nutrition but also more in how the food choices I make affect the planet. I have gotten more interested in eating a whole food plant-based diet. This is similar to a vegan diet but, in addition to eating foods that don't contain animal products, a whole foods diet also minimalizes processed ingredients.



A whole foods diet has many healthy benefits. It can help to decrease weight gain and obesity, decrease heart disease, may decrease cancer and can help in decreasing diabetes. The other true benefit of a plant based diet is how much better it is for the environment.

Eating a meat based diet is huge source of water usage. According an article in *Foodtank*, it takes 1800 gallons of water to produce on pound of beef and 718 gallons of water to produce one pound of pork. To raise one pound of soybeans it take only 206 gallon of water. And consider how many people a pound of soybeans can feed. A lactating cow needs 2 gallons of water per 100 lbs. of body mass. The average weight of a milking cow is between 1200 and 1500 lbs. You do the math!!

According to a human league article in April 2024, what we eat is the biggest contributor to our individual carbon footprint. Every step of production for animal products contributes to greenhouse gases--these steps include clearing forests for grazing land, producing food to feed animals, and the mass of waste that animals produce. Oxford University has stated that we could decrease our greenhouse gasses by 73% if we went to a plant-based diet.

We lose species of plants and animals every day as more and more land is cleared to produce more meat. Deforestation for animal agriculture is the biggest cause of species loss. If we eat less meat, there will be less incentive for the meat industry to destroy more land. In addiction, deforestation also leads to soil loss as there is less agriculture and more land for grazing.

As Christians, we need to always be thinking of those less privileged. Eating a plant based diet helps to combat world hunger. All the environmental changes caused by the meat industry increase climate change and puts more and more people at risk as our planet gets hotter and drier. With less land being used to produce meat products, we could also produce more plant products which would help to combat the world food crisis.

We as a population need to consider all we can do to save the planet Earth. Start simple--eat one meatless meal a week. Consider it an adventure. There are a million and one interesting recipes on the internet using all kinds of locally grown ingredients. I have even become a lover of tofu now that I know how to cook it. Are you ready to save the planet just one step at a time?

One of my favorite websites for recipes is Halfbakedharvest.com. Just for fun, try 20-minute Siracha Lime and Creamy Cashew Fettuccini. It's a very rich, healthy sauce that goes with vegetables and a starch of any kind. I like to add a little baked tofu to add a little extra protein. Enjoy the journey.

Calling all Peace Greeters ...

Peace is a friendly church! All of us are greeters when visitors who are looking for a church home show up at our door. Here are some things EVERYONE can do.

- Smile and greet people warmly.
- If you're not sure if someone is a visitor or a member, don't worry! We are all unsure sometimes. Just say, "I don't recognize you. Are you a visitor or a member I haven't met yet?" They'll be happy you asked and, either way, you'll have made a new friend!

If you sign up to be an Official Greeter, here are some additional things for you to know. We have special Peace Mugs with tea and cookies prepared for new visitors, and we keep them in the upper freezer drawer in the small kitchen near the Bethlehem room. Before you situate yourself at the front door to greet, bring two of the mugs out and put them on the Visitor Table.

- Arrive at 8:30 am and stay at the door until the prelude begins.
- Greet everyone warmly as they come through our doors.
- If someone unfamiliar arrives, ask, "Are you a visitor or a member I haven't met yet?"
- If they are a first-time visitor, give them a Peace Mug as a gift,
- Ask all visitors to sign the guest book on the Visitor Table.
- If you are able, check on the visitors before and after service to make sure they've connected with someone.
- At the end of worship, return any unused mugs to the upper freezer in the small kitchen near the Bethlehem Room.

PREPARING FOR BIBLE STUDY: PAUL'S LETTER TO THE ROMANS

I look forward to starting a study of the Letter to the Romans, and I hope to see you on these dates: Tuesdays at 10:30 – 11:30 a.m. in Room 107 –

I am reviewing 2 study guides and will have a table in the narthex on Sunday, September 8th for you to see the material and sign up to participate. We may discover that we will need to continue the study after Christmas and New Year's in order to complete all 16 chapters of Romans. Pastor Ron Brooker and I plan to meet to discuss the study guides.

The guide I am most impressed with states the following objectives:

- 1. To provide you with a firm foundation of understanding and a thirst for learning.
- 2. To give you all the historical background, word definitions, and explanatory notes you need so that your main reference is the Bible.
- 3. To teach how to let God's Word transform you into Christ's image.

The introduction gives us background on Paul and Rome and a timeline of Paul's ministry. It has a summary of his work as a missionary, his background as Saul the Pharisee, why he wants to visit Rome, and his desire to make a journey to Spain, where the gospel has not yet been preached.

I will conclude this article by quoting from the guide: "The Righteousness of God"

"Paul's letter to the Roman's systematically unfolds the gospel of God's Son, the revelation of the *righteousness of God* (see Romans 1:16-17). In it, Paul deals with such huge and knotty issues as sin, guilt, salvation, grace, law, faith, works, righteousness, justification, sanctification, redemption, death, resurrection, the place of the Jews in God's plan of salvation, and the way we should live in light of our salvation. Martin Luther calls this book "the daily bread of the soul." Feast on!"

MISSION TEAM STRUCTURE BEING UPDATED

For the past several years, Peace has been organized into a *Deeply Rooted, Bearing Fruit* structure of five Mission Teams: Expanding Vision, Communal Worship, Service (previously Public Witness), Faith & Fellowship (previously Healthy Connections & Faith Formation), and Hospitality (new).

This structure has helped us live into our mission in Christ, especially through leadership transitions. The last couple of months the PLC Church Council has been in discernment about this might be restructured to better reflect how ministry happens and to encourage more participation from the whole congregation. The Council has been engaging in questions such as: *Is the Mission Team structure working? Does the congregation know about it? How do we invite the whole congregation to live out our shared mission? How could we function more effectively?*

For now we have identified 10 Focus Areas that capture ministries that happen here at PLC. **This is a work in progress.** There are likely things missing too. If you have any questions, thoughts, or suggestions, talk to a Council member or Pastor Hannah.
