INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Follow the direction of the ushers and kneel or stand at the rail. The Bread Minister will hand you a piece of bread (gluten-free wafers are available, just ask the bread minister). There are two Wine Ministers. The first pouring chalice offers wine and the second chalice is grape juice.

If you choose not to receive communion, you may come forward for a blessing from the Bread Minister. Crossing your arms over your chest will indicate that you would prefer a blessing.

If you have difficulty coming to the front, please notify an usher and communion will gladly be brought to you.

Have you noticed our new AED? An AED, or Automated External Defibrillator, is a portable device that delivers an electric shock to the heart to treat sudden cardiac arrest. In the case of cardiac emergency, the AED can be used--by anyone--until EMTs arrive. It can be found in the white box on the wall in the narthex just outside the side doors to the sanctuary. Orient yourself with this life saving device that we hope we never have to use.
