

FIRST READING

¹Shout out, do not hold back! Lift up your voice like a trumpet! Announce to my people their rebellion, to the house of Jacob their sins. ²Yet day after day they seek me and delight to know my ways, as if they were a nation that practiced righteousness

and did not forsake the ordinance of their God; they ask of me righteous judgments, they delight to draw near to God. ³ "Why do we fast, but you do not see? Why humble ourselves, but you do not notice?"

Look, you serve your own interest on your fast day,

and oppress all your workers.

⁴Look, you fast only to guarrel and to fight and to strike with a wicked fist.

Such fasting as you do today

will not make your voice heard on high.

⁵ Is such the fast that I choose, a day to humble oneself?

Is it to bow down the head like a bulrush, and to lie in sackcloth and ashes?

the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard.

SECOND READING

2 Corinthians 5: 20b - 6: 10

^{20b}We entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God, ²¹ For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

^{6:1} As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. ² For he says.

"At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you."

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! ³We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴ but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵ beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶ by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, ⁷ truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; 8 in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹ as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰ as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-21

[Jesus said to the disciples:] ¹ "Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven.

² "So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. ³ But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

⁵ "And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. ⁶ But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

¹⁶ "And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. ¹⁷ But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, ¹⁸ so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

¹⁹ "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; ²⁰ but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

*INVITATION TO LENT

Friends in Christ, today with the whole church we enter the time of remembering Jesus' passover from death to life, and our life in Christ is renewed.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love—strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

*CONFESSION OF SIN

P: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

Silence is kept.

P: Most holy and merciful God,

C: we confess to you and to one another, and before the whole company of heaven, that we have sinned by our fault, by our own fault, by our own most grievous fault, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone.

- P: We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.
- C: Have mercy on us, O God.
- P: We have shut our ears to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.
- C: Have mercy on us, O God.
- P: Our past unfaithfulness, the pride, envy, hypocrisy, and apathy that have infected our lives, we confess to you.
- C: Have mercy on us, O God.
- P: Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people, we confess to you.
- C: Have mercy on us, O God.
- P: Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to share the faith that is in us, we confess to you.
- C: Have mercy on us, O God.
- P: Our neglect of human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty, we confess to you.
- C: Have mercy on us, O God.
- P: Our false judgments, our uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, we confess to you.
- C: Have mercy on us, O God.
- P: Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us, we confess to you.
- C: Have mercy on us, O God.
- P: Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.
- C: Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.

EXTENDED CONFESSION & REFLECTION TIME

"From dust you came, and to dust you shall return." (Genesis 3:19b)

This verse—spoken to us when we receive the imposition of ashes on our foreheads—reminds us of our humanity. So in full honesty, recognizing that life is messy and life is complicated, **make a list of 5-10 challenges you are struggling with**. Name anything that is hard or heavy in this moment. Perhaps you ask yourself, "What do I need in this moment?" and write down some of your needs. Write them down in a journal, on a notecard, on the doodle page provided, or in your heart. Challenge yourself to think of the core emotion underlying each challenge. For example, instead of simply saying, "I'm busy," perhaps you might confess: "I overcommit myself because I worry that others will think I'm selfish if I say no." Name your challenges and your confessions, offering them all to God.

Take a moment to look over your list. Ask God for forgiveness for the things you can control. Ask God for grace for the things you cannot.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES


P: Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth.

SETTING LENT INTENTIONS & TIME OF PRAYER

So often it is difficult for us to answer the question, 'What do you need?' In this quiet time, check in with yourself. What do you need at this moment? What do you need in this season? What do you need to draw closer to God?

Write down your hopes you have for this Lenten season. Write them down in a journal, on a notecard, on the doodle page provided, or in your heart. As you write, consider these written hopes to be intentions that you are setting for the six weeks ahead. Set an intention: the fast you will choose, the alms or service you will give, the prayer you will hold onto, the behavior you will seek to change. Think of this not as a *giving-up*, rather an *adding-to*.

These are not intended to be aimless wishes on stars, but instead, thoughtful intentions for your one wild and precious life. How might God be repairing what feels broken in your life?

*LORD'S PRAYER


C: Our Father in Heaven
