CALL TO WORSHIP

SECOND WEEK OF LENT - THE NEED FOR SLEEP

By following the story of Jesus and his friends' overactive ministry, we'll see how loss of sleep and sleep deprivation affect Jesus' tiny team. We'll find ways to honor God's call to rest: in sleep, in peaceful moments, and in honoring God's sabbath commandment.

*CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

P: Our forty-day journey through Lent recalls Jesus' temptation in the wilderness. Three times, the devil coaxed Jesus to rely on himself instead of on God. Three times, Jesus resisted, trusting God to give him all he needed.

Friends, we are not Jesus. We don't recognize relying on ourselves instead of God as a temptation; we even extol self-reliance as a virtue. Join me in confessing this to God, and asking for compassion.

Silence for reflection.


- P: God, I confess
- C: that I struggle to confess. I want to delight you by doing all the right things. I don't want to admit that I can't. To receive your forgiveness, I must confront my failure.
- P: God, I confess
- C: that I struggle to confess: I'm afraid of being a burden to others. I don't want to need them too much, so I try not to need them at all.
- P: God, I confess
- C: that I struggle to confess: just like I turn away from my own vulnerability I turn away from the vulnerable. I have rejected my weakness and avoided those who are weak. I have denied my frailty and looked down on those who are frail. I have resisted my dependence and thought less of those who depend on others.
- P: God, forgive us,
- C: because we struggle to forgive ourselves. We build a wall of self-reliance that separates us from your love.

P: Jesus once said,

"Those who are well have no need of a physician." Jesus didn't come for those who didn't need him: he came for me and for you and for everyone who has fallen short. Jesus' power is made perfect in our weakness. In Christ's name, you are completely and entirely forgiven. You are imperfect, and you are forgiven, and you are entirely loved.

FIRST READING

Genesis 15: 1-12, 17-18

¹ After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." ² But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³ And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." ⁴ But the word of the Lord came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." ⁵ He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." ⁶ And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.

⁷ Then he said to him, "I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." ⁸ But he said, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" ⁹ He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." ¹⁰ He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. ¹¹ And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

Luke 9: 28-36





Struggling to find a primary care doctor? Facing long waits when you need care right now? Have you been forced to travel out of town—even out of state—because there is no local specialist?

Join us for an important conversation with local doctors, who are working to address the crisis and increase access to care for all New Mexicans. The panel, moderated by Dr. Arthur Berkson, President of the Doña Ana Medical Society, will share their experiences, discuss barriers to recruiting physicians and possible solutions for improving access to healthcare.
