

CALL TO WORSHIP

FIRST WEEK OF LENT - THE NEED TO EMBRACE VULNERABILITY: Our society overemphasizes individualism: our strength, our bootstraps, our independence. Starting from the story of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness, we examine how Jesus' humanity is fully realized through his vulnerability—and since Jesus embraced his vulnerability, we are called to do the same.

*CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

P: Our forty-day journey through Lent recalls Jesus' temptation in the wilderness. Three times, the devil coaxed Jesus to rely on himself instead of on God. Three times, Jesus resisted, trusting God to give him all he needed.

Friends, we are not Jesus. We don't recognize relying on ourselves instead of God as a temptation; we even extol self-reliance as a virtue. Join me in confessing this to God, and asking for compassion.

Silence for reflection.

P: God, I confess

C: that I struggle to confess.
I want to delight you by doing all the right things.
I don't want to admit that I can't.
To receive your forgiveness,
I must confront my failure.

P: God. I confess

C: that I struggle to confess:
I'm afraid of being a burden to others.
I don't want to need them too much,
so I try not to need them at all.

P: God, I confess

C: that I struggle to confess:
 just like I turn away from my own vulnerability
 I turn away from the vulnerable.
I have rejected my weakness
 and avoided those who are weak.
I have denied my frailty
 and looked down on those who are frail.
I have resisted my dependence
 and thought less of those who depend on others.

P: God, forgive us,


C: because we struggle to forgive ourselves.

and you are entirely loved.



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FIRST READING

Deuteronomy 26: 1-11

¹When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, 2 you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. ³You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us." 4When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, ⁵ you shall make this response before the Lord your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. ⁶When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, ⁷ we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. ⁸ The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; ⁹ and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. ¹⁰ So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me." You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God. 11 Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.

Romans 10: 8b-13

^{8b} "The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart"

(that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); ⁹ because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. ¹¹ The scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame." ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. ¹³ For, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

'Worship the Lord your God,

and serve only him."

⁹ Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, ¹⁰ for it is written,

so that you will not dash your foot against a stone."



INVITATION TO COMMUNION

All are invited to the Lord's table for communion, regardless of age or church membership. Come forward up the center aisle, taking an empty cup from the tray at the front. Follow the direction of the ushers and kneel or stand at the rail. The Bread Minister will hand you a piece of bread (gluten-free wafers are available, just ask the bread minister). There are two Wine Ministers. The first pouring chalice offers wine and the second chalice is grape juice.

If you choose not to receive communion, you may come forward for a blessing from the Bread Minister. Crossing your arms over your chest will indicate that you would prefer a blessing.

If you have difficulty coming to the front, please notify an usher and communion will gladly be brought to you.

Weekly Lenten Study from ELCA Sumud: "For Justice in Palestine & Israel." Join Pastor Hannah on Tuesdays in Lent for a special time of study and prayer. Sumud is the ELCA's ministry in response to occupation and injustice in Palestine and Israel. The Sumud leadership has released a Lenten resource for group study, featuring videos from the Holy Land and devotions from Palestinian theologians. Each week we will watch a video together, read a devotion, have discussion and pray together. No prep is needed; come as you are. Beginning this Tuesday, March 11, we will meet from 10:30-11:30 AM in Room 107.

Midweek Lent Soup Suppers & Evening Prayer begin Wednesday, March 12. Sign-up sheets for soup, bread, & set-up/clean-up are in the Narthex. **ANYONE, whether they're in a group or not, can sign up to bring Soup** or help in other ways. The Groups are designated so set up and clean up are organized.

LENTEN EVENING PRAYER ON WEDNESDAYS - After soup each Wednesday, we will gather at 7:00 PM in the sanctuary for a simple service called *A Refuge for the Heart: Midweek Worship with Healing Prayer*. During this worship, prayer stations will be offered, inviting participants to pray in a certain way: with a prayer minister, writing down prayers, lighting a candle, using other objects/icons/images/water, etc. Each week will follow the same rhythm but be a little different. Come for some stillness, song, and healing during this season.

Have you noticed our new AED? An AED, or Automated External Defibrillator, is a portable device that delivers an electric shock to the heart to treat sudden cardiac arrest. In the case of cardiac emergency the AED can be used -- by anyone -- until EMTs arrive. It can be found in the white box on the wall in the arthex just outside the side doors to the sanctuary. Orient yourself with this life-saving device that we hope we never have to use.
